


2015 contributions: \$373.25 billion by source (in billions of dollars – all figures are rounded)






2015 contributions: \$373.25 billion by type of recipient organization (in billions of dollars – all figures are rounded)






Changes in giving by source 2013–2014, 2014–2015, and 2013–2015 (in current dollars)





Changes in giving by source 2013–2014, 2014–2015, and 2013–2015 (in inflation-adjusted dollars, 2015 = \$100)






Changes in giving by type of recipient organization, 2013–2014, 2014–2015, and 2013–2015 (in current dollars)










2013 to 2015, cumulative*


Giving by individuals, 1975–2015 (in billions of dollars)





Giving by foundations, 1975–2015 (in billions of dollars)




Giving by bequest, 1975–2015 (in billions of dollars)






Giving by corporations, 1975–2015 (in billions of dollars)






Giving by source: Percentage of the total in five-year spans, 1976–2015 (in inflation-adjusted dollars, 2015 = \$100)






Total giving by source in five-year spans, 1976–2015 (in billions of inflation-adjusted dollars, 2015 = \$100)






Trends in total giving, 1975–2015 (in billions of dollars)






Total giving as a percentage of Gross Domestic Product, 1975–2015 (in inflation-adjusted dollars, 2015 = \$100)






Total charitable giving graphed with the Standard & Poor's 500 Index, 1975–2015 (in billions of inflation-adjusted dollars, 2015 = \$100)





Corporate giving as a percentage of corporate pre-tax profits, 1975–2015 (in current dollars)









Giving to religion, 1975–2015 (in billions of dollars)






Giving to education, 1975–2015 (in billions of dollars)



Giving to foundations, 1978–2015* (in billions of dollars)





Giving to public-society benefit, 1975–2015 (in billions of dollars)




Giving to arts, culture, and humanities, 1975–2015 (in billions of dollars)





Giving to international affairs, 1987–2015* (in billions of dollars)










Number of volunteers, in millions of people, 2004–2014
